Scholarship:

The North-South Institute Scholarship in International Development

Description:

This award was established in 2010 by The North-South Institute (NSI) in honour of the many years of service given to the NSI by its outgoing President, Roy Culpeper. It is awarded annually in the spring, where merited and pending availability of funding, to a Masters Student, who is or will be enrolled full time in the School of International Development and Global Studies or the Graduate School of Public and International Affairs. Students whose program of studies or research touch on themes of aid and international education, health, international trade and finance, peace-building, the environment, employment and migration, as well as gender dimensions in these thematic areas, are encouraged to apply.

Value:

\$1,500 funded by The North-South Institute

Application:

Interested students should forward their CV, recent transcripts and a Letter of Intent outlining why they are interested in pursuing studies and a career in international development. **Applications should be sent to the Unit (EDIM or GSPIA) where the student is register by February 29th.** The successful student will meet with The North-South Institute in the fall and give a short presentation on his/her research or a relevant paper to Institute staff during the academic year.

(The Scholarship Selection Committee will be composed of the Director of the School of International Development and Graduate Studies, and the Associate-Director of the Graduate School of Public and International Affairs and a representative of The North-South Institute.)

Deadline for Application:

February 29th

Eligibility:

Candidates to or students currently enrolled in the Masters Program in the School of International Development and Global Studies or the Graduate School of Public and International Affairs. The student must be enrolling full-time for the academic year 2012-2013.

Criteria:

Student's research or course of studies focuses on an international development theme (e.g. aid, international education, health, trade and finance, the environment, employment or migration issues).
